

ICAR-Indian Institute of Soil Science, Bhopal Celebrated International Women's Day

The women cell of ICAR-Indian Institute of Soil Science organized the International Women's Day (IWD) program at village Borkhedi, Phanda Thesil, Bhopal District, on 6th March 2022. A one-day training cum workshop was organized to sensitize and train the farm women on "Improving the livelihood of farm women through managing soil health, waste to wealth and women nutrition" About 150 farm women, including the scientist and technical staff of the Institute, participated in the program.



Dr. Sangeeta Lenka, Chairperson, Women Cell, addressed the gathering on the importance of celebrating women's day, highlighting the theme of "DigitALL: Innovation and technology for gender equality." The Chief Guest, Ms. Kokila Chaturvedi, M.P. Jan Abhiyan Parishad, Bhopal, emphasized the need for adapting to the advances in technological change and education in the digital age for achieving gender equality and the empowerment of all women and girls.
